Biographies

Stephen Sondheim Music and lyrics

Sondheim is one of theatre's most celebrated composers and lyricists. He created musicals for more than fifty years. He won more Tony Awards than any other composer – eight, including the Special Award for Lifetime Achievement – as well as an Academy Award, Pulitzer Prize, Olivier Award, eight Grammy Awards and the Presidential Medal of Freedom. His acclaimed works include Follies, Company, Assassins, Into the Woods, A Little Night Music, A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum, Merrily We Roll Along, Sweeney Todd and the lyrics to West Side Story and Gypsy. He became a RADA Honorary Fellow in 2019.

George Furth Book

George Furth was an American playwright, librettist and actor. He had a successful acting career appearing in films such as *The Boston Strangler*, *Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid* and *Shampoo*. His television credits include *Happy Days*, *Murder*, *She Wrote* and *Little House on the Prairie*. He worked with Stephen Sondheim on a number of musicals including *Company*, winning a Tony Award for Best Book, *Merrily We Roll Along* and *Getting Away with Murder*. Other theatre work includes: *The Act*, *Twigs*, *The Supporting Cast* and *Precious Sons*.

Nona Shepphard Director

Nona Shepphard is RADA's Associate Director, Chair of the Audition Panel and International Consultant at the Lir Academy in Dublin – RADA's sister school. She is also a freelance writer and director, with over 170 productions and 50 commissioned plays to her credit.

In the few years before lockdown, she worked internationally - in the Philippines, where she created and directed *The Tempest Re-Imagined* at PETA Theatre in Manila; this was a fusion of Shakespeare's play with survivors' stories from the catastrophic hurricane Haiyan of 2013; she directed *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, in San Antonio, Texas, and she devised and directed a large, site specific project in Freemantle, Western Australia called *The House On the Hill. Company* is the third Sondheim musical she has directed at RADA after *Assassins* in 2018 and *Sweeney Todd* in 2022.

Sarah Rose Bodalbhai Musical Director

Sarah is delighted to be musically directing Company at RADA this year, having worked as Assistant Musical Director on last year's production of Sweeney Todd and for some years as an accompanist/MD as part of RADA's singing team. Outside of RADA, Sarah's freelance musician work is exciting and varied. She is a highly accomplished pianist, adaptable to a wide range of genres including pop, jazz, classical and MT and she particularly enjoys live improvisation. She has worked with many of the UK's top cabaret performers and currently has a Saturday night residency at London's Phoenix Arts Club alongside host Michael Twaits. She was nominated for an Offie award for Best Musical Director in 2018 for her work on How To Catch A Krampus (London's Pleasance/Sink The Pink), written/directed by Ginger Johnson. She also releases her own singersongwriter material as Sarah Rose (@sarahrosesounds) and you can find her EP Beautiful Ruins and latest single Same Dreams on all streaming platforms.

Alex Beetschen Musical Supervisor, New Orchestrations and Arrangements

Alex is a graduate of Jesus College, Cambridge and The Royal Academy of Music.

Judith Croft Designer

Judith Croft trained in Theatre Design at the Bristol Old Vic Theatre School. After resident design roles at Northampton, Chester and Oldham Theatres, she became Head of Design for the Library Theatre Company in Manchester for over twenty years. During this time, Judith designed many productions for the company, several of which won awards, including Waiting For Godot, Someone To Watch Over Me and Hard Times, a site-specific promenade production in a disused cotton mill.

Judith has also worked extensively as a freelance designer for many venues and types of theatrical productions. Work includes opera at RNCM, Falstaff; In the West End, Laughter on the 23rd Floor with Gene Wilder; Musicals and Rock n' Roll pantomime at Theatr Clwyd and Leeds City Varieties; site specific work with several companies including The Chester Mystery Plays 2008 and 2013; work abroad with Vienna's English Theatre including Sleuth, Hello, Goodbye and The Mousetrap.

She has designed several productions for RADA Business to be presented on Cunard ships and three previous productions for the Jerwood Vanbrugh Theatre, *Dying For It, Assassins*, and Sweeney Todd all with Nona Sheppherd directing.
